ABOUT THE MUSIC

Steve Reich: Duet (1993)

Steve Reich composed *Duet* in 1993, and it is dedicated to Yehudi Menuhin, and to those ideals of international understanding which Sir Yehudi had practiced throughout his life. Beginning and ending in the key of F major, the music is built around simple unison canons between the two violin soloists who, from time to time, slightly vary the rhythmic distance between the two voices.

Gabriella Smith: Imaginary Pancake (2020)

Gabriella Smith's *Imaginary Pancake* was commissioned by Carnegie Hall for pianist Timo Andres, who says of the work "it's not only a blisteringly virtuosic showpiece, but a beautiful, grand sculptural form". The piece was inspired by a memory from summer camp, when she heard an older student play something with both arms outstretched to the extremities of the piano, supposedly by Beethoven. When she tried to find the music as an adult, she quickly realized that time had exaggerated the memory—the image of a player leaning over the keyboard morphed into "flat like a pancake".

Nico Muhly: Drones & Viola (2011)

According to composer Nico Muhly, "I started writing Drones with Viola as a method of developing harmonic ideas over a static structure. The idea is something not unlike singing along with one's vacuum cleaner, or with the subtle but constant humming found in most dwelling-places. We surround ourselves with constant noise, and the Drones pieces are an attempt to honor these drones and stylize them."

Marcos Balter: Ligare (2014)

Marcos Balter's Ligare for six instruments employs subtle microtones and whistling to create an atmospheric, disembodied soundscape— a subtle study in color and timbral change. It is based on the György Ligeti's "Lontano", which Stanley Kubrick used as part of the score for "The Shining".

ABOUT THE MUSIC

Gabriella Smith: Tessellations (2017)

Tessellations by Gabriella Smith places listeners between two streams of music, meandering, brushing against one another, and separating again. The first stream begins with a persistent rhythm beaten on the body of a cello while a mass of rhythmic fragments accumulates rapidly alongside it. In the other stream, short, playful glissandi stretch and elongate to overtake static held tones in the trumpet and clarinet. Echoed and tapering from rough, pounding bass clarinet articulations to subtler, Vivaldian shimmer is the piece's gradual unspooling from thick, ensemble textures to the solitary rhythm that began it.

Nico Muhly: Honest Music (2002)

Nico Muhly's *Honest Music* is an out-take, a rehearsal for another, wholly imaginary piece. Long, expressive, Romantic gestures pile up one on top of another. The other fragments, initiated in character by the accompaniment, sound more like scraps swept from a cutting-room floor somewhere— all false starts, warm-ups and after-beats—glitchy and half-baked. But the gravity and authority of the harmonies (and low drones) lend the makeshift nature of the piece an authentic drama; the sad beauty of things coming together and things falling apart.

Andrew Norman: *Gran Turismo* (2003)

At first glance, Italian Futurist Art, Baroque Concerto Grosso and a race car video game seem to be utterly dissimilar entities, but in 2003 Andrew Norman, almost by accident, discerned the inherent similarities between these endeavors, namely, speed and flamboyant machismo. These characteristics inspired him to write *Gran Turismo*, a motoric, virtuoso piece for eight violins that sets off on a musical collision course of kinetic energy right from the first note. *Gran Turismo* is dedicated to the students of Robert Lipsett, who premiered the work at USC.

ABOUT THE ARTISTS



NADIASIROTA

Nadia Sirota is a violist, conductor, and Peabody Award-winning producer and broadcaster. She is known for her "tenaciously good ear and her ability to throw herself bodily into the landscapes that composers bring to her." (Pitchfork) In all branches of her artistic life, she aims to open classical music up to a broader audience. Nadia's singular sound and expressive execution

have served as muse to dozens of composers, including Nico Muhly, Missy Mazzoli, Marcos Balter, and David Lang.

As a soloist, Nadia has performed with orchestras around the world, and released four albums of commissioned music. She is a member of the chamber sextet yMusic, and has lent her signature sound to a dizzying array of projects, appearing on albums and concert stages with such popular artists as The National, David Bowie, Björk, Paul Simon, Ben Folds and Anohni.

Nadia received a Peabody Award for her podcast Meet the Composer, which she co-created, co-produced, and hosted. Nadia is the co-founder of Eclipse Projects, an independent producer and arts management company based in Los Angeles. From 2018-2022, Nadia served as the New York Philharmonic's first Creative Partner, a position created for her. Nadia received her undergraduate and Master's degrees from the Juilliard School, where she studied with Heidi Castleman, Misha Amory, and Hsin-Yun Huang.

ABOUT THE ARTISTS

ILANASETAPEN

Since her solo orchestral debut at age 15, **Ilana Setapen** has been flourishing as a violinist with a powerful and original voice. She is hailed by the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel as a violinist with "a sparkling sound" and "the kind of control that puts an audience completely at ease." She is currently the First Associate Concertmaster of the Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra.

In recent seasons, Setapen has had solo performances with the Milwaukee Symphony, Festival City Symphony, and the Amarillo Symphony, among others. She held the Assistant Concertmaster position of the Grant Park Music Festival Orchestra in Chicago for 6 years and is a favorite guest concertmaster with the Chicago Philharmonic. She is currently on the faculty at Center Stage Strings at the University of Michigan, and she performs frequently with Present Music. Solo and chamber music performances have brought her abroad to China, France, Brazil, Holland, England, Monaco, and Italy.

Setapen grew up in Amarillo, Texas. She was a student of Robert Lipsett both at the University of Southern California and at the Colburn Conservatory. She received her Master of Music Degree from the Juilliard School as a student of Donald Weilerstein and Ronald Copes.

JOHNBIAN

Violinist **John Bian**, born in St. Paul, Minnesota, is an active orchestral musician who has studied with many notable concertmasters across the country. He has been a member of the Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra since 2018 and in 2022 began serving as the Assistant Principal Second Violin. He also serves as a substitute violin in many major orchestras around the country such as the Chicago, Cleveland, Pittsburgh, Minnesota, St. Louis, and Detroit Symphony Orchestras. In addition to his orchestral career, John is also a passionate chamber musician having studied with members of the Cleveland, Cavanni, Calidore, and Muir Quartets.

John earned his bachelor's degree at Boston University where he studied with Yuri Mazurkevich. At BU, he was the grand prize winner of both the Solo Bach Competition in 2012 and the Concerto Competition in 2014. He went on to complete his master's degree at the Cleveland Institute of Music where he studied with William Preucil, the concertmaster of the Cleveland Orchestra and was also a member of the Intensive String Quartet program. He then finished his schooling at the University of Michigan studying under David Halen, concertmaster of the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra, and Yoonshin Song, concertmaster of the Houston Symphony Orchestra, receiving his Specialist Degree in 2018.

In the 2024/25 season John will join the Philadelphia Orchestra.
